



Set Designer/Builder





TENNESSEE WILLIAMS

Playwright, A Streetcar Named Desire





Thomas Lanier Williams III (March 26, 1911 – February 25, 1983), known by his pen name Tennessee Williams, was an American playwright and screenwriter. Along with contemporaries Eugene O'Neill and Arthur Miller, he is considered among the three foremost playwrights of 20th-century American drama.

At age 33, after years of obscurity, Williams suddenly became famous with the success of The Glass Menagerie (1944) in New York City. It was the first of a string of successes, including A Streetcar Named Desire (1947), Cat on a Hot Tin Roof (1955), Sweet Bird of Youth (1959), and The Night of the Iguana (1961). His drama A Streetcar Named Desire is often numbered on short lists of the finest American plays of the 20th century.

A Streetcar Named Desire was the winner of the 1948 Pulitzer Prize for Drama. It still ranks among William's most performed plays, and has inspired many adaptations in other forms, notably the critically acclaimed 1951 film starring Marlon Brando as Stanley Kowalski and Vivien Leigh as Blanche DuBois, a role she had also played on stage in London's West End in 1949. Williams also wrote short stories, poetry, essays, and a volume of memoirs. In 1979, four years before his death, Williams was inducted into the American Theater Hall of Fame.
