## **About the Show**

Good intentions collide with absurd assumptions in Larissa FastHorse's wickedly funny satire THE THANKSGIVING PLAY, as a troupe of terminally woke teaching artists scrambles to create a pageant that somehow manages to celebrate both Turkey Day and Native American Heritage Month.

A high school drama classroom located anywhere but the Los Angeles area.

This show runs approximately 90 mins with no intermission.

# A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTORS

When we were chosen to be co-directors on this project, we immediately fell into step with each other and our vision of the play. Most importantly, we both shared a healthy amount of fear and apprehension. Larissa FastHorse's wickedly smart satire must be handled right and as true to the intention as possible. This required some big swings with the content. Our promise to each other was to have true collaboration, check for blind spots, and call each other in/out if need be. We truly held up every choice, every detail under the microscope - we thank all of those that followed us through this project for their dedication, time, and hard work.

We said from the beginning that this show would fly or fail based on the success of finding a true ensemble. Our cast walked into the project on day one humble, with open minds and hearts ready to tackle their discomforts, ask questions, and learn. We are proud of them, and wish them a wonderful run.

The irony of two white people directing the show is not lost on us; this is the brilliance of Larissa's message within *The Thanksgiving Play*. It is impossible to be a part of this production as a non-Indigenous person without stepping into the realities of our privilege, our positionality to our history, and our relationship with the notion of 'taking space.' These characters hold up the mirror to the self professed ally, and we are no exception.

Larissa FastHorse designs her one-act plays where "the first act happens here in the space [...] the second act happens after you leave" (FastHorse, The Broadway Show, 2023). We directed the first act; the second act is in your hands.
