A STREETCAR NAMED DESIRE

About the Show

This classic drama about the realities facing women in family and societal structures in the late 1940's comes alive when older sister Blanche, forced to leave their grand ancestral home, comes to stay with her sister, Stella, and Stella's working-class husband Stanley.

Setting

The scene is the two rooms of the Kowalski apartment in the French Quarter of New Orleans. The action of the play takes place in the spring, summer and early fall.

This show runs approximately 120 mins with an intermission.

A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

I have been fortunate in my career to direct *A Streetcar Named Desire* twice. The first time, in 2011, was South Korea's first English language production of the play. It toured two cities and was a profound experience. I never imagined that I would be so lucky to tackle this text again, but 14 years later I have been given that opportunity. My perspective approaching the text comes with more life experience and growth alongside our culture's understanding of trauma, gender-based violence and mental health and has created a drastically different production than the one I directed all those years ago.

Approaching *Streetcar* in 2025 has been a deeply personal, profound and powerful experience. Through the rehearsal process I have found myself constantly thinking of my own experiences and relationships and thinking, often, of my grandparents. My paternal grandfather trained for WW2 in New Orleans, and though he came back home to Orillia, this is how I imagine Stanley found himself making New Orleans his permanent home after the war. My maternal grandfather served in Italy, just like Stanley and Mitch, in a place where very few men made it home. We have spent much time imagining how that experience inform's Stanley and Mitch's connections to each other, the world, and the women around them.

As a feminist, it is impossible to approach this show without spending time considering the rights, opportunities, and lack thereof, for women in 1947 while comparing that to the modern experience. What is the same? What is different? Why, nearly 80 years later, are there so many themes and moments through this show that are relatable and familiar to so many women? Will there be a time when we are all safe in our homes? Will there be a time when we are all liberated from societal expectations of beauty, youth and femininity? Will there be a time when societal, relationship and family structures are genuinely not stacked against us?

I hope, like us, you consider these questions when you find yourself in New Orleans. In the French Quarter. In the home of Stanley and Stella Kowalski on a warm spring afternoon when an hour isn't just an hour, but a whole piece of eternity dropped into your hands.

Nan, this one's for you.
